Step 5: Glue with Care

Less is more when it comes to glue. Apply a thin, even layer to the tab using a toothpick or the tip of your glue bottle. Avoid getting glue on the visible surfaces of the model. Press the tab into place and hold it firmly for 15-30 seconds to ensure a strong bond. Use tweezers to hold small tabs in place. Work

systematically, usually from the chassis up. Let the glue dry completely before moving to the next section. Rushing this step is the most common cause of a collapsed or misaligned model.

TIPS FOR A PROFESSIONAL FINISH

To elevate your paper car from a simple craft project to a stunning display model, pay attention to these finishing details.

- **Use Quality Paper:** Glossy photo paper can give your **3d paper car cut out template printable** a beautiful, showroom-quality shine. However, it is harder to glue. Matte cardstock is easier to work with and hides glue marks better.

- **Be Patient with Curves:** Some car designs have gentle curves, like the hood or the roof. To create these, gently roll the paper around a cylindrical object like a pencil or a marker before gluing it into place. This "pre-forms" the curve and prevents unsightly creases.
