Programming TV Control with Genie Remotes

5. If the code is correct, the green light will flash three times and stay on. The TV should turn off.
6. Press the **POWER** button on the remote to turn the TV back on to confirm.
7. Test volume control. If it works, you're all set. If not, repeat with the next code.

Tip: If none of the listed codes work, you can try an automatic code search. Press and hold **MUTE** and **SELECT** until the light flashes three times. Press **TV**, then press the **CHAN UP** button repeatedly (once per second) until the TV turns off. Then press **ENTER** to lock the code.

METHOD 3: PROGRAMMING A DIRECTV REMOTE FOR AUDIO DEVICES

Many users want to control their soundbar or AV receiver with their DIRECTV remote. The process is similar to programming for a TV. Here's how to do it:

1. Turn on your audio device.
2. Press and hold the **MUTE** and **SELECT** buttons until the green light flashes three times.
3. Press the **AUX** or **AV1** button (depending on your remote).
4. Enter the 4-digit code for your audio brand (e.g., 30054 for Sony).
5. Test the volume and mute functions. If they work, you're done.

TROUBLESHOOTING COMMON ISSUES

- This often happens when you're holding the wrong combination of buttons. For manual code entry, ensure you're pressing **MUTE** and **SELECT** simultaneously, not **ENTER**.
- Try restarting the process from scratch with a fresh battery pull.

ADVANCED TIPS: USING THE DIRECTV MOBILE APP AS A REMOTE

If you lose your physical remote or want a backup, the DIRECTV mobile app can also control your receiver. This is not programming a physical remote, but it's a handy alternative. Simply download the DIRECTV app, sign in, and select **Remote**. You'll need your receiver to be connected to the same Wi-Fi network. This method also teaches you **how to program**

DIRECTV remote in a digital sense, as you can assign custom macros or shortcuts.

Resetting Your DIRECTV Remote to Factory Defaults

2. Press the **INFO** button. The green light will flash three more times.
3. Press the **MENU** button. The light should blink once, indicating a reset.
