Start with the Easier Pieces

If you are new to the music, begin with "O Tannenbaum" or "What Child Is This" — these are slower and have simpler chord progressions. "Linus and Lucy" is rhythmically more challenging due to its syncopated groove. Practice slowly with a metronome, and gradually increase tempo as you become comfortable.

Use Sheet Music

as a Guide, Not a Rulebook
