Once all six bands are assembled, gently rotate the ring in your fingers. It should feel smooth and seamless. If there is a gap or if the bands feel loose, you may have a band in the wrong order. If it feels wrong, disassemble by gently pushing the key band back out and try a different arrangement of the base or top bands.
